Foster home FAQ

How long do cats stay in foster care?

Until they are adopted, which can take anywhere from a week to several months.

Do foster cats have to be integrated with my own pets?

You may keep your foster cat in a separate room from your pets. However, integrating them may help with socialization, which will increase adoptability.

How do RCR cats get adopted without an RCR shelter?

RCR promotes adoptable cats on its website and social media. Potential adopters complete an application and are screened by adoption coordinators. Successful applicants are connected with the foster home to make arrangements to meet the cat. If the meeting goes well, an adoption contract is signed and the cat goes to its forever home.

What are the foster home's responsibilities?

- Provide daily cat care (food, water, well-maintained litter boxes, cuddles and play)
- Transporting cats to vet clinics
- Meeting with potential adopters and facilitating adoptions
- Liaising with the pet rescue team
- Participating in adoption promotion events and photo sessions
